Brass, Woodwinds, Recorders & Ensembles Adjudicator David Gerry

David Gerry is currently on the faculty of the School of the Arts, McMaster University and is a core member of the McMaster Institute for Music and the Mind. Dr. Gerry received his Ph.D. from the School of Psychology, Neuroscience and Behaviour at McMaster, and also holds a M.Mus. and B.Mus. from the University of Toronto, an ARCT from the Royal Conservatory of Music, and a diploma from the Talent Education Research Institute in Japan where he studied with Shinichi Suzuki. He has been a keynote speaker at numerous education conferences. David is also on the faculty of the Great Lakes Flute Centre. For many years, he was the music specialist at Trail Ridge Montessori School in Grimsby, Ontario. He is a Registered Teacher Trainer for the Suzuki Association of the Americas and the European Suzuki Association.

Dr. Gerry's research on formal musical experience in infancy, funded by the Grammy Foundation, is the first study to show the effects of musical training on social, cognitive, linguistic and brain development in 6 to 12-month-old subjects. His current research projects include measuring the effects of formal musical experience on school readiness, the development of a test battery to measure creativity, and the effects of Dalcroze training on musical expertise in elementary students. David is also active as a performing flutist and is much sought after as an expert in the field of flute pedagogy.
